

## Recipe of the Month/ROASTED ASPARAGUS

2-LB Fresh Asparagus cut into 3-4 inch pieces.

1-lb Shrimp or Chicken (pre-cook)

Grated Parmesan or cheese of choice

Herb and onion seasoning

Crushed Garlic

Alfredo Sauce (Jar or homemade).

Place cleaned asparagus onto a 9 x 12

baking sheet. Season with preferred seasonings (see above). Scatter cooked meat and parmesan over the asparagus Drizzle alfredo sauce over all. Place in the oven 350 degree for 30 minutes or until asparagus is tender.
