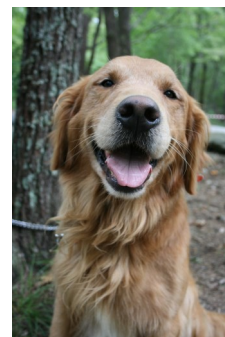
ANNUAL DOG LICENSING

Recipe of the Month/ Grilled Chicken Caprese

Chicken Breasts
olive oil
lemon zest
fresh thyme (or sub-dried thyme) or sub oregano
fresh mozzarella cheese ball (or sub goat cheese),
cherry or grape tomatoes
fresh basil leaves
garlic
balsamic vinegar
salt and pepper

Optional Garnish: Balsamic Glaze, Basil Pesto

Pound chicken breasts into equal thickness, about 3/4 inch thick and flat. Place in a big bowl, drizzle with olive oil to coat all sides, then sprinkle all sides with the salt, pepper and garlic powder, tossing to coat evenly. Toss in the lemon zest and thyme. Grill the chicken.

While the chicken grills, make the fresh tomato-basil salad. In a medium bowl toss well with olive oil, balsamic, salt and pepper. Slice the fresh mozzarella and place it on the chicken – let it melt, closing the lid. Once the mozzarella cheese is perfectly melty- the chicken is ready to serve. Place chicken on a platter and spoon the tomato salad over the top, and

garnish with a drizzle of balsamic glaze. For extra flavor, a few drizzles of pesto are also nice here, Serve the chicken with your starch or veggie of choice and dinner is served! Pesto purple potato's are a great choice!

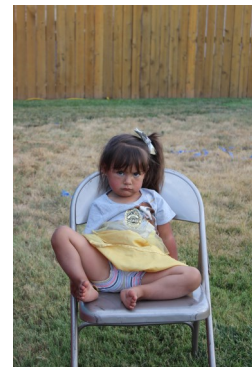

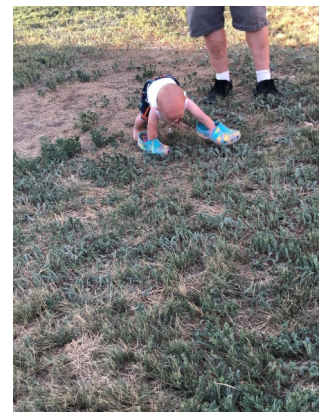
