TOWN UPDATES

The new fill station is still in progress. The Town is in need of a contract review before training and connections can begin.

The Irrigation Pump in the river has been pulled and is in need of repairs or replacement. The decision was to refurbish the pump we have rather than go with a new one at 3 x's the cost. The work will be done in TX.

The Town is needing to upgrade the water billing program. Windows 10 is a thing of the past. The Neptune program will be updated along with several computers.

Prop 123: The Town is eligible to apply for up to \$300,000 in projects. The goal would be to seek the full amount with different "projects" or aspects of one project that we would take on one after another so as to not go beyond our bandwidth by doing it all at once. The Town is working with the

State on exactly how we would define our projects.

Bad news: The Town's snow plow bit the dust. Good News until a truck replacement occurs: Mesa County will temporarily take over a portion of the plowing. Their 1st priority will be the County Roads including bus route, up the cutoff. The 2nd priority will be any bus routes. The main thoroughfare will be covered by DBPW unless there is a significant snowfall requiring Mesa County assistance

Public works has been busy



Recipe of the Month

FRESH TOMATO PENNE:

7-med. To large fresh tomatoes
1/2 c. diced onion
5-6 peeled fresh whole garlic cloves
1/2 cup water
6 oz ricotta
1/2 c. shredded mozzarella
1/4 c. chopped fresh basil
Parsley/parmesan garnish

Pour 2 T oil in a frying pan. Place 7 tomatoes around the outside surface of the pan. Place the onion and garlic in the center circle of the tomatoes. Pour 1/2 c water over all. Cover steam 15-20 min. Meanwhile cook 1/2 lb. penne noodles. Next, pull tomato peels off with tongs, then mash all together and blend in the ricotta, and mozzarella cheese and the fresh basil. Mix well and simmer 5-7 min. Add drained cooked penne. Stir well/heat

through and serve. Garnish with shredded parmesan and fresh parsley.
