## Recipe of the Month/ SOFT PUMPKIN SNICKERDOODLES

1/2 c. butter, softened

1 1.2 c. sugar

1 egg

1/2 c. pumpkin puree

3 c. flour

1 t. cream of tartar

2 t . Baking soda

1/4 t. salt

1 t. pumpkin spice

Cinnamon Sugar mixture.

Preheat oven 350. degrees. grease baking pan. (cookie

sheet). In lg. bowl, cream together butter, sugar, egg and pumpkin until smooth. Add the flour, tartar, baking soda, salt and pumpkin pie spice. Mix thoroughly. Roll the dough into 1-in. balls, then roll ball in cinnamon. Sugar mixture until covered. Place on baking sheet, spacing evenly. Lightly press down each dough ball with spoon or fingers to slightly flatten. Bake in pre-heated oven for 8-10 min. or until edges are set and the cookies

are just beginning to crack on top. Remove from oven and let cookies cool on baking sheet for a few minutes before transferring to wire rack to cool completely.

Pumpkin Pie Spice = 1/2 t. cinnamon, 1/4t allspice, 1/4t nutmeg, 1/4 t ginger.

Sugar Mixture = 2 T sugar & 2 t. cinnamon.
