Britt with the Comp Plan brought in 27 responses to the second land use survey during the Wild Horse Days. Event. We encourage the Community to complete the second survey and make your voices heard in the Master Planning for the future.

Feral Cat mitigation: The Town has focused time on trying to mitigate the issue and appreciates the Community taking on responsibility for the issue as well. The last count was 28 cats that have been captured, fixed and then re-

turned. Traps were borrowed and Carlina and volunteers, were able to utilize free vouchers.

The Town hosted a regional hazard mitigation training for Firefighters, Water Operators, support staff, and administrators. Items were discussed such as water supplies during fires, firefighting chemicals that may impact water treatment, mudslides that impact our ability to make water and so forth. The Broadband project is becoming more visible to the public. The Carrier neutral structure is set on county grounds. The generator and



interior components, are being installed along with fire suppression equipment. We are waiting on RR flaggers to begin setting the fiber line east of Roan Creek Rd. Still looking to complete in 2025. That is great news!!

BRUIN WASTE MESSAGE



Over the next couple of months Bruin Waste will be replacing broken containers throughout the town of Debeque. Many of the old Dependable Waste containers are broken/cracked and or missing components that are making it difficult for the trucks to dump as well as allowing trash to fall out. This will take place only on

trash pickup days. The truck will dump and remove the old container from the customer while on route, then later the same day it will return and drop off a new container to the customer. The containers will be swapped randomly depending on the severity of the damage and at the discretion of our drivers. The majority

of the cans should be replaced in a month or two, but this process will go on indefinitely as containers do get fatigued and break over time. If a customer finds that their cart has gone missing on trash day, then they can expect a new container by the end of the day.

Recipe of the Month/Sausage, potato and Cabbage Soup

2 Tbsp. canola oil 1 (14-ounce) package kielbasa or other cooked sausage, sliced 1/2 yellow onion, chopped 1 large carrot, chopped 1/2 medium green or savoy cabbage, chopped .Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper 2 cloves garlic, chopped 6 cups chicken broth 2 large russet potatoes, peeled and chopped 2 Tbsp. red wine vinegar

2 Tbsp. chopped fresh dill Crusty bread, for serving Heat oil in a large pot or Dutch oven over medium heat. Add kielbasa and cook, stirring occasionally, until browned, 8 to 10 minutes. Use a slotted spoon to transfer to a plate. Add onion, carrot, and cabbage to pot. Season with salt and pepper. Cook, stirring occa-

sionally, until vegetables are softened, 5 to 6 minutes. Add garlic and cook until fragrant, 1 to 2 minutes. Add broth, potatoes, and sausage. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer until potatoes are cooked through, 17 to 20 minutes. Remove from heat. Stir in vinegar and dill. Serve with crusty bread. ENJOY!


